# Tenses in the Time Clause

French	English
<b>Futur simple</b> <i>Quand tu auras 18 ans, tu pourras voter.</i>	<b>Simple present</b> <i>When you are 18, you'll be allowed to vote.</i>
<b>Futur antérieur</b> <i>Nous discuterons de cette question quand les enfants seront allés se coucher.</i>	<b>Present perfect</b> <i>We'll discuss this question when the children have gone to bed.</i>
<b>Passé simple, passé composé, imparfait</b> <i>Quand j'étais enfant, ceci n'était qu'une petite ville.</i>	<b>Simple past</b> <i>When I was a child, this was only a small town.</i>
<b>Passé antérieur</b> <i>Quand il eut relu sa copie, il la rendit.</i>	<b>Past perfect</b> <i>When he had proofread his paper, he handed it in.</i>
<b>Conditionnel passé</b> <i>Il a dit qu'il commencerait quand tout le monde serait arrivé.</i>	<b>Past perfect</b> <i>He said he would begin when everyone had arrived.</i>

## Spotting a time clause

**Tip: replace it by an adverb such as ‘tomorrow’.**

- *Quand tu auras l'argent* tu pourras t'acheter une voiture  
= *demain* tu t'achèteras une voiture.  
When you have enough money, you'll buy yourself a car.
- Je ne sais pas quand il viendra ≠ \*Je ne sais pas demain.  
I don't know when he will come.

## Ambiguous cases



- Tell me when you arrive.  
= Appelle-moi à ce moment-là, au moment de ton arrivée.
- Tell me when you'll arrive.  
= Donne-moi l'heure de ton arrivée.
